What are cookies and what do they do?

A cookie is a small text file which is placed onto your device (e.g., computer, smartphone or other electronic device) when you use our website. We use cookies on our website to record that you have been shown the information about the cookies we set, to distinguish between humans and bots using our contact form so we can reduce spam, to analyse how people interact with our website for statistics and marketing purposes. For example, we may monitor how many visitors we receive, how they access our website (e.g. from a search engine or directly inputting our address) and how long people spend on each page of the site. This infor-

mation will be used in aggregate to help us to understand how people are using our website so that we can improve it and so that we can review and adapt our general marketing strategy. We also used cookies in relation to advertising our services on LinkedIn.
